






The \$4 million Orient Express was the park's premier attraction in 1980. It is the largest steel roller coaster in the World.



Construction of Worlds of Fun's sister park began June 11, 1981 with an official "Wave Breaking" ceremony.

Jack Steadman, president of Worlds of Fun, christened the aquatic park as Oceans of Fun by breaking a giant water bottle against a 41-ton earthmover.

The \$6 million, 60-acre park is being constructed on a wooded site just south of

Worlds of Fun.

Oceans of Fun will feature over 30, tropically-themed attractions including a million-gallon wave pool creating ocean-like waves for rafting and body surfing, a four-acre lake for skiing exhibitions, giant pretzel-like water slides and a children's wading pool and play area.

Support facilities include restaurants, shops, clubhouse, picnic grounds, games area and group-outing areas.

Ocean's of Fun is scheduled to open Memorial Day Weekend 1982. Its season will run through Labor Day.
