Park guests journey through magical world

Ten magic years ago a new world opened. A special world, different from all others. Crossing the S.S. Henrietta, one embarks on a journey into this magical world.

A guest's journey begins with an introduction to the Americana section. Here, the Cotton Blossom (from the classic movie "Showboat") is visible. Docked placidly on the edge of Americana, it separates the newest addition to the park—the River City area, with its thrilling Rampage. A distinct American flavor is experienced in Americana's Bicentennial Square. This tribute to America's heritage is apparent through the twisting corkscrew of the Screamroller and the Aerodrome area with its towering Barnstormer and Incred-o-Dome.

Continuing on around the park brings one into the Orient section. This section is home for the world's largest steel roller coaster, the Orient Express. It also contains a favorite park attraction—the Fins and Flippers Dolphin show.

Upon hearing the echo of the Yodeler, one finds himself in Scandinavia. One of the best-liked sections of the park, Scandinavia boasts the Viking Voyager and the Tivoli Music Hall, bringing the best of Broadway to the Midwest. Scandinavia also contains the Victrix, which like the Cotton Blossom was once a pirate ship used by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer.

Upon descending the gangplank of the Victrix, one spies the thatched roofs of the Big Game Hunt, senses the pulsating rhythm of the bongos, and the roar of the Zambezi Zinger marking their presence in Africa. This section entertains guests with such favorites as the Zulu, Ali's Alley and the Casbah.

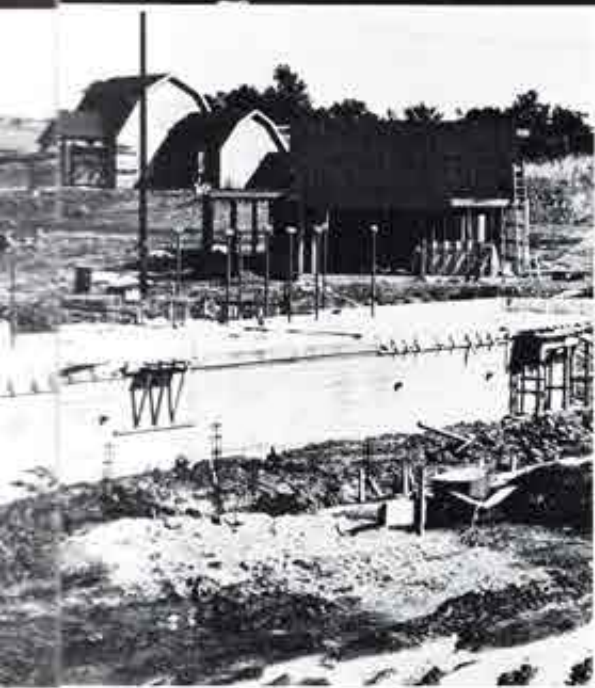

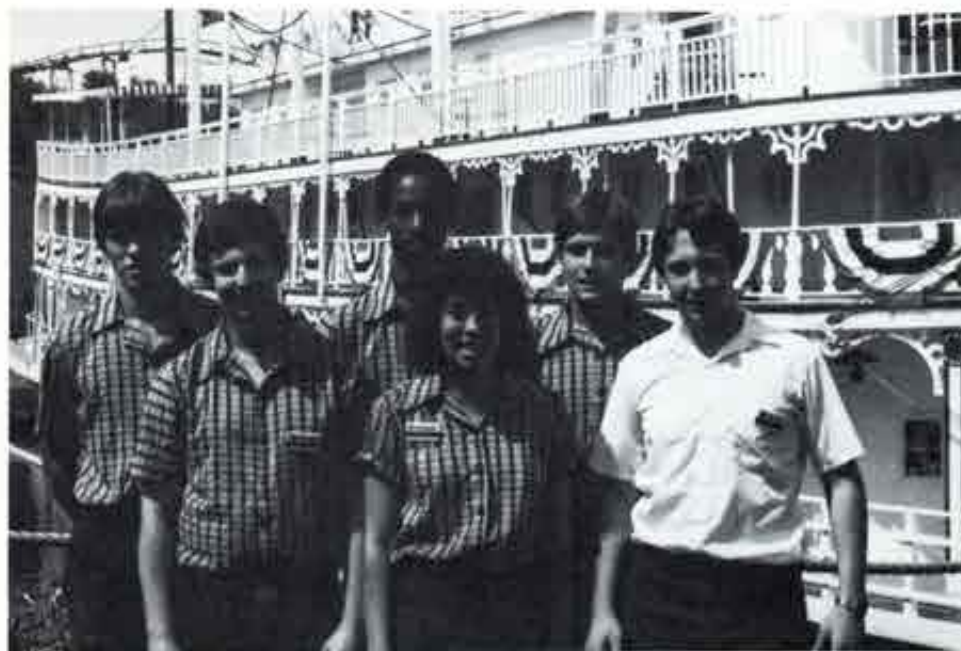

Located in the front of the park, Americana is the first section guests see. Chosen as the sight of the Grand Opening back in 1973, Americana acted as host for the 10-year "makin' magic" celebration this year.

Over the years, Americana has grown tremendously along with the rest of the park. Bicentennial Square, added in 1976, was designed in honor of the 200th birthday of the United States. This area contains its own roller coaster—the Screamroller, which is a double-looped coaster.

In 1981, the Incred-O-Dome was added. This attraction has a 180 degree quadrispherical screen that enables guests to go on a plane ride through the plush hills of Hawaii and up to the heights of Mount St. Helens.

This year brought the plans

and construction of River City. River City is located along the wharf area behind the Cotton Blossom. It consists of several gift shops and the newest ride—the thrilling Rampage.

The Americana section also houses Game Street USA which offers a wide variety of games ranging from skeeball to a coin toss. Front Street, also in Americana, is especially noted for its shops and boutiques. In addition to the wide variety of shops, Americana also offers many culinary delights designed to please even the most finicky of eaters.

Over the past 10 years, Worlds of Fun has developed into one of the largest and most recognized theme parks in the area. Each year the park expands to become bigger and better. Here's to another 10 Years of Makin' Magic!

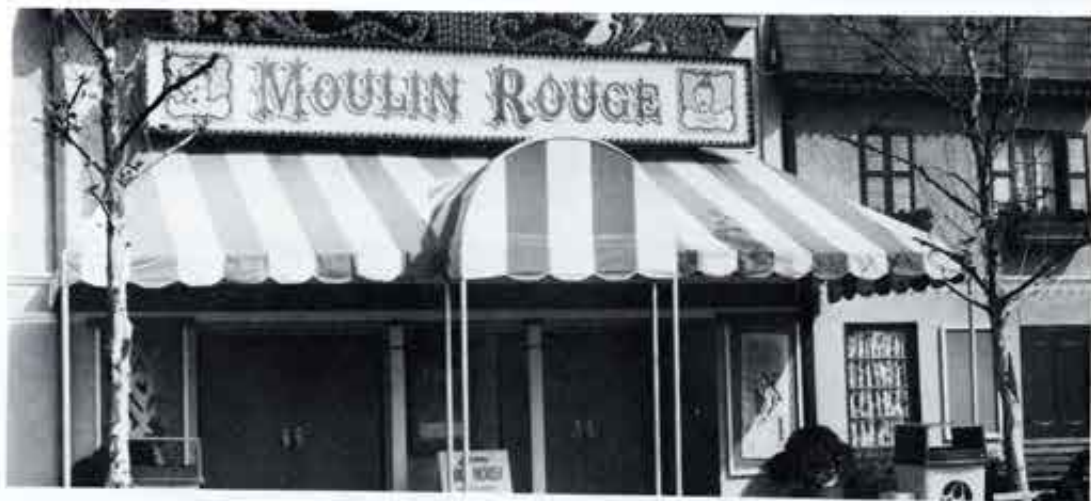

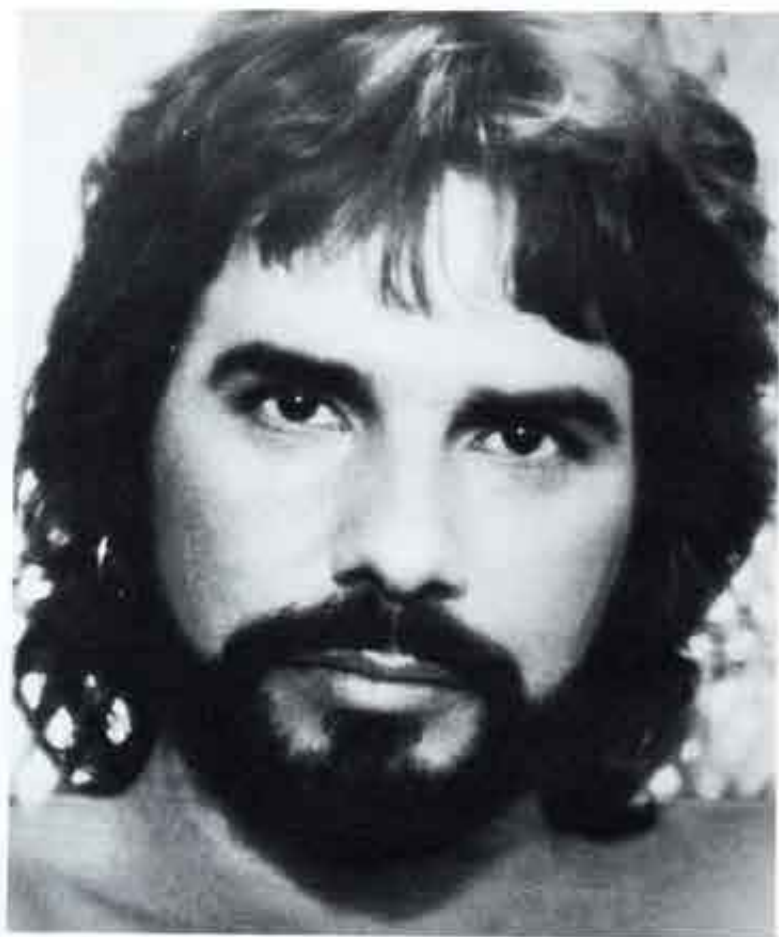

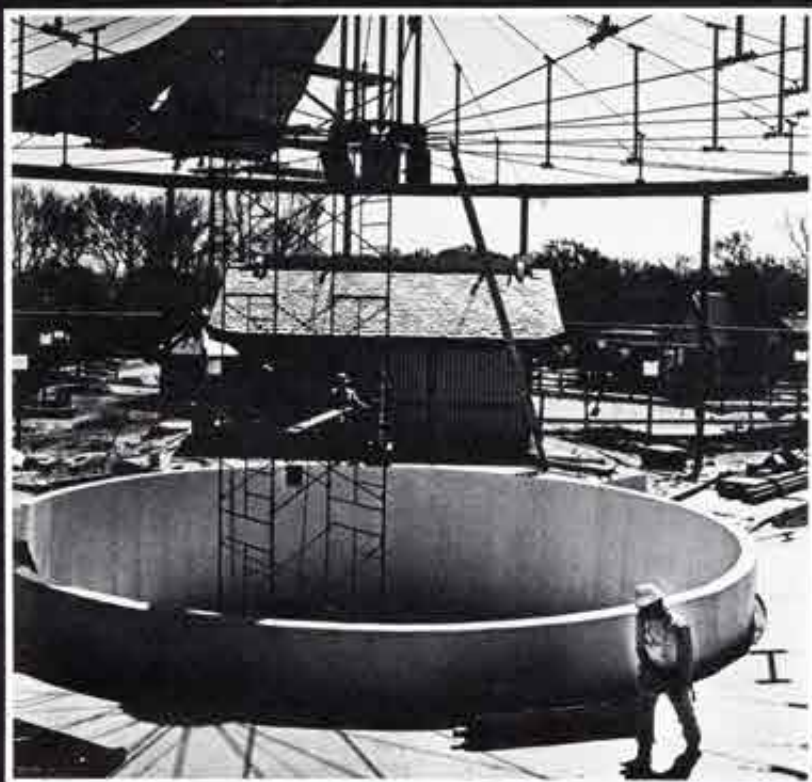

Decisions pertaining to the park's budget and expenditures are made at this time, by General Management and Finance, as well as decisions regarding operating days and hours. The choosing of the park's themes (we are all familiar with '10 Years of Makin' Magic'), and how to best present these themes to the public in the most appealing manner, are determined by the Marketing Department.

The Personnel Department screens the huge flood of applications, deciding who goes where according to their interests. Personnel also decides how to train, and to entertain Ambassadors with movies, parties and trips.

Representatives from Merchandising, Food Service, Ride

Operations and Security visit other parks, and study our own parks' records to determine what gift ideas, menus, and rides, are popular, how and where to make improvements, and how to incorporate new ideas for real crowd-pleasers. Acting upon these decisions, Purchasing orders and Warehouse stores the items until park opening.

In addition, departments like Maintenance, Research and Development, and Construction can erect a new ride, build a new shop, add a new section, or even nurture the dream of a new park into a reality.

And then there are those in Landscaping who can cleverly carve and sculpt the ground into a beautiful array of bright flowers, sloping hills, and blue-green waterfalls and lakes.

Show Productions examines the local and big-name talent to ensure our guests of the excitement and glitter of the best Broadway and Forum entertainment. Costumes see to it that all 2,000 Ambassadors look their best, and that our most famous Ambassadors (Grrrtrude Gorilla, Sam Panda, and Dan'l Coon) are ready to greet our guests in their typical furry fashion!

The Administration Building houses those people whose year-long investment and energies culminate in the magic that Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun becomes for employees and guests alike.

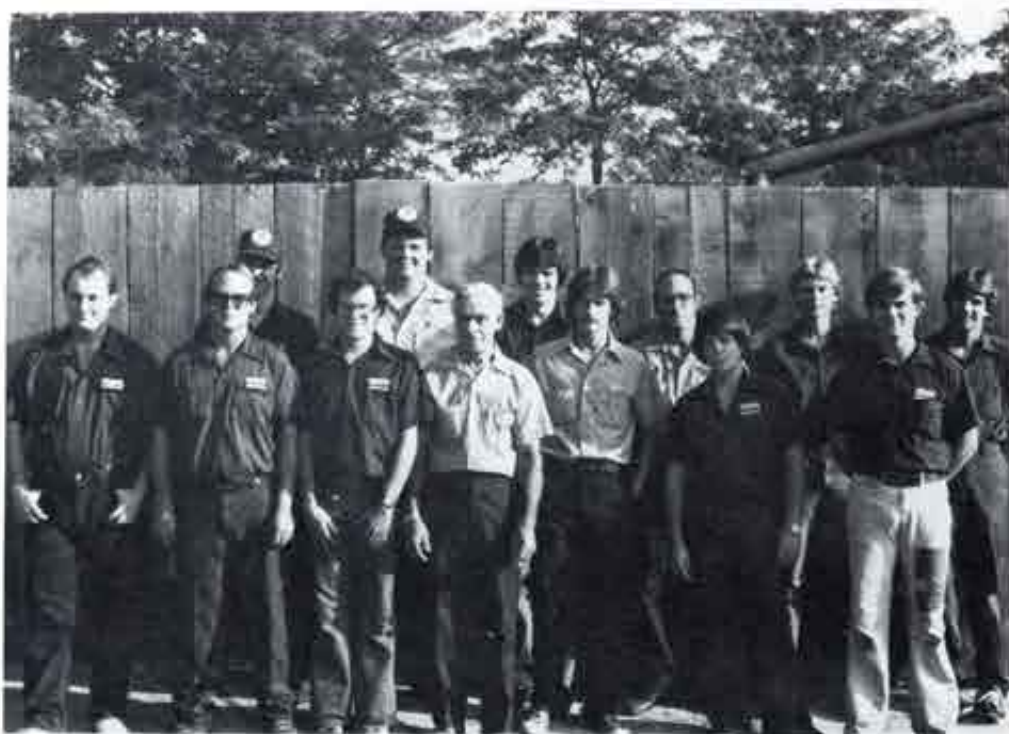

Diamond Head sends you spiraling down over 1200 feet of slides, from the Waikiki Wipeout to the Maui WoWee to the

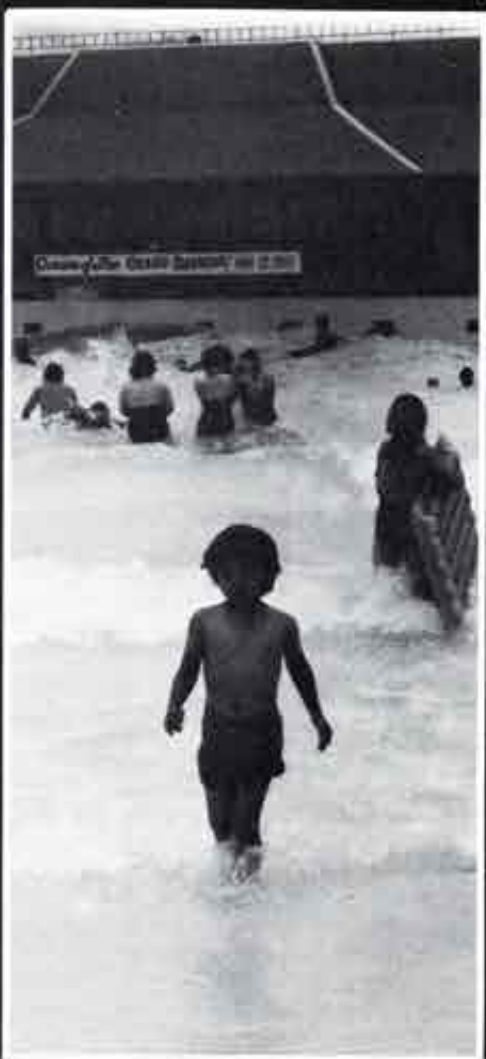
Honolulu Lulu.

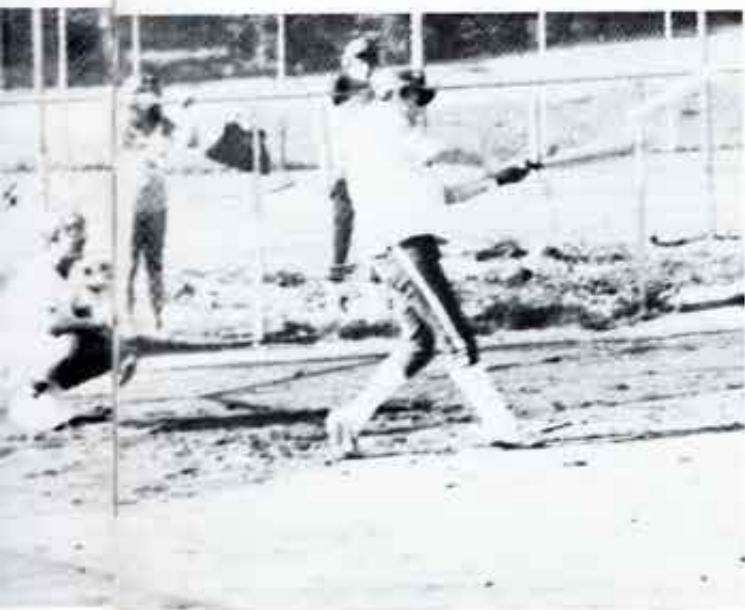
